

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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The future of ABMDR is already here, and it has every reason to be as exciting as our organization's first 25 years. That's because our future will continue to be fueled by two powerful factors: our commitment to growing, innovating, and collaborating as a global medical organization; and the support which the worldwide Armenian community is capable of providing for our activities.



The ABMDR Lab in Yerevan remains the heart of our work in Armenia. Our Lab is the only one of its type in the Caucasus, and the only facility in the region to be accredited by the European Federation for Immunogenetics (EFI). As such, the ABMDR Lab will continue to perform its critically-important work, including HLAtyping; bone marrow stem cell harvesting, which has facilitated 43 transplants to date; and DNA cryopreservation. Having introduced cutting-edge molecular testing in Armenia, our Lab will likewise continue to improve the country's DNA-based medical technologies, for

enhanced diagnosis, treatment, and survival of patients. As importantly, by functioning as a reference lab for solid-organ kidney transplantation, it will continue to help reduce the risk of organ rejection and post-transplant failure.

What stands behind these accomplishments is our wonderful Yerevan staff, which, year after year, helps ensure ABMDR's status as a dynamic national registry. Our approach to continually maintaining that status is two-pronged, comprising technological advancement and professional growth. Just as we will continue to adapt new technologies, our Yerevan staff continues to make strides by acquiring advanced skills and knowledge, as well as institutional recognition through the earning of diplomas and specialized licenses. As I write these lines, I am delighted to note that ABMDR is now eligible to receive accreditation by the World Marrow Donors Association (WMDA), having fulfilled all of the latter's criteria. This is a highly prestigious turning point.

It is thanks to such achievements that our Lab was recently designated by EFI as a regional training hub. For the same reason, our Lab will continue to be a training ground for not only local university students, but those from the Diaspora as well. This year, for instance, many students from the US, including members of our vibrant youth group, NextGen, will intern at our Yerevan Lab.

Today, as we look ahead to the next chapter of our beloved organization, our profound gratitude goes to our benefactors, Board members, and volunteers for making all this a beautiful reality. At the same time, it is our strong hope that more and more segments of the global Armenian community, including organizations, churches, and schools, will join our cherished mission of saving lives, particularly through youth activism. Ask the Doctor: a conversation with ABMDR Executive Director Dr. Sevak Avagyan



Q. As ABMDR has completed a quarter century, how would you characterize it now?

A. I would characterize it as vibrant and mature. Within Armenia, ABMDR is acknowledged as the organization that not only brings hope to patients afflicted with blood illnesses like leukemias and lymphomas, but also one that introduced the practice of fact-based medicine and DNA-based technologies that help local doctors diagnose and/ or treat many illnesses. Internationally, ABMDR is highly respected by immunogenetics and transplantation communities across the world, recognized for its excellence, treated as a colleague among equals, and held as an example to new countries trying to start their own registries.

Q. Is a global presence important for ABMDR?

A. Absolutely. Any patient's chance of finding a match is greatly enhanced by the close collaboration between registries. But in the case of Armenian patients, who are dispersed all over the world, close collaboration with all registries and transplant centers within the global community is an absolute must.

Q. How do you navigate this global network of registries and transplant centers?

A. By working with them hand in and, keeping our memberships active, participating in meetings and conventions, and, mostly, by keeping our standards very high. ABMDR has been a long-time member of Bone Marrow Donors Worldwide (BMDW), World Marrow Donors Association (WMDA), American Society for Histocompatibility and Immunogenetics (ASHI), and the European Federation for Immunogenetics (EFI).

Our laboratory is set up and operates according to the highest standards required by these bodies. We are regularly inspected and accredited by EFI. This year, having fulfilled all criteria in terms of number of donors provided annually, donor traceability software, number of transplants facilitated, and overall performance, we are eligible to apply for WMDA accreditation. This will bring us into an elite group of registries, and will greatly enhance our ease of operating with transplant centers and registries throughout the globe. We already have two members of our team serving as EFI inspectors, and recently we were asked by the EFI Board to mentor and supervise two candidates from Georgia who are training and working towards getting their EFI technician's licenses.

Q. What's the secret to keeping your standards high?

A. The short answer is, "by educating, training, and retraining our staff." Our technicians are trained and re-trained in leading labs in Europe, and accredited by theses bodies. For example, Ani, our lab technician, is studying to take her EFI technician's license exam. Alina, our database manager, already an EFI-certified technician, also attained Search Coordinator status, and is now working on her European Specialization in Histocomplatibility and Immunology diploma from the European Society for Histocompatibility and Transplantation. Armine, our laboratory supervisor, has had all of these licenses. In addition, a few years ago she passed the required training and exam, and became a designated EFI inspector. She has already inspected several labs in the region and in Europe. This year, Armine also got her European Specialization in Histocomplatibility and Immunology diploma, which qualifies her as a laboratory director or co-director. I must point out that each and every one of these diplomas requires serious study, training, and a rigorous exam. It is a lot of work, but it keeps our standards high, and inspires a great deal of confidence in our laboratory.

Q. Does ABMDR also continue to serve as a regional center for education for many in the field?

A. Yes, of course. In the past, on three different occasions, we have organized and hosted EFI regional workshops/meetings, which brought together scientists from the Caucasus region, plus Europe and the US. In addition, we have opened our lab to scientists interested in the field, and many students from Armenia and the Diaspora have already spent time in our laboratory to get valuable hands-on experience. This year, we have several members of our NextGen group in the US heading to our lab for their summer internships. We hope to continue and even expand this program in the coming years.

ABMDR performs 42nd, 43rd, and 44th harvesting procedures

On April 10, 2024, a young Yerevan resident, Garik Petrosyan, donated bone marrow stem cells for an urgent transplant that could help her sister survive a life-threatening blood-related illness, as requested by the German National Bone Marrow Donor Registry (ZKRD).

The harvesting of the donated stem cells was the 42nd such procedure to be performed by ABMDR. The painless, non-invasive harvesting took place at ABMDR's Stem Cell Harvesting Center, in the Armenian capital.

Garik said that from the very first day that a donor match was being sought for her sister, who lived in Germany, he had a feeling he would end up being identified as a match, for a chance to save her life. As soon as Garik was notified that he was in fact identified as a matched donor for his sister, he eagerly reported to the ABMDR headquarters, where he underwent the preliminary phase of the stem cell harvesting and subsequently the harvesting itself.

The procedure was performed by Dr. Andranik Mshetsyan, the Stem Cell Harvesting Center's resident physician. Also present were ABMDR Executive Director Dr. Sevak Avagyan, Medical Director Dr. Mihran Nazaretyan, and other lab personnel. Within mere hours of the procedure, the harvested stem cells arrived in Germany, personally delivered by a specially-licensed international courier.

Less than seven months later, on November 6, 2024, Garik once again donated bone marrow stem cells for his sister. The harvesting was the 44th such procedure to be facilitated by ABMDR (the 43rd harvesting procedure took place in September 2024, as reported on the following page). As soon as the harvesting of Garik's stem cells was completed, they were once again entrusted to a special courier and flown to Germany, to help save the life of Garik's sister through a transplant.

Anyone in good health between the ages of 18 and 50 can register with ABMDR as a potential bone marrow stem cell donor, for a chance to save someone's life. Given the unique genetic makeup of ethnic Armenians, ABMDR needs to maintain a robust global registry of Armenian donors.

In September 2024, ABMDR received a request from the Russian National Bone Marrow Donor Registry for assistance in identifying, typing, and collecting stem cells from an unrelated male potential donor. The stem cells of the potential donor were urgently needed for a transplant that could help save the life of a child in Moscow diagnosed with leukemia. Within a few days, the young potential donor arrived at the ABMDR Stem Cell Harvesting Center to undergo testing. He was identified as a complete match with the recipient, and Dr. Andranik Mshetsyan and his staff lost no time to perform a stem-cell harvesting. The donated stem cells were flown to Moscow the very same day.

Commenting on the procedure, ABMDR Executive Director Dr. Sevak Avagyan said, "This is a very special and unique case of successful collaboration between two internationally recognized bone marrow donor registries, with positive and satisfying outcomes for both parties. As such, this harvesting procedure demonstrates the critical importance of close cooperation between countries, toward the twin goals of saving patients' lives and maintaining professional partnerships."



ABMDR becomes training hub for technologists at EFI-accredited labs

ABMDR has been granted one more prestigious role by the European Federation for Immunogenetics (EFI), by becoming a regional training hub for technologists working in EFI-accredited labs. The purpose of the training is to enable technical staff to demonstrate knowledge and competence within their workplace. The training program for the Caucasus region, consisting of an intensive online course, is conducted and supervised by ABMDR President Dr. Frieda Jordan and ABMDR Laboratory Supervisor Armine Hyusyan. The training program, developed by the EFI Education Committee, is known as ETHIQ, which stands for European Technical Histocompatibility and Immunogenetics Qualification.





The first event, the Team Alex Toy Drive, which collects toys for Children's Hospital Los Angeles, was held in honor of 16-year-old cancer survivor Alex Darbinyan. It took place on December 8, at St. Leon Cathedral of the Western Diocese.

During the event, a team of ABMDR Board members and volunteers was on hand to answer questions about the Registry and administer a simple, painless swab test, as part of the process of joining the organization. ABMDR also participated in the Hye Riders Toy Run, held in Pasadena on December 15 and likewise dedicated to Alex Darbinyan. During the Toy Run, which featured music, food, and raffles in a fun family atmosphere, attendees donated toys while a team of ABMDR volunteers familiarized them with the work of the organization. Commenting on the success of the Team Alex Toy Drive, Rosie Diremsizian, Alex's mother, said, "When Alex was diagnosed with leukemia at six years old, it was the hardest time of our lives. During our long stays at the hospital, we discovered that the

only thing that could light up Alex's face was a toy handed to him by the hospital staff. For every blood draw, procedure, or round of chemotherapy, Alex received a new gift. While nothing could take away the pain of his treatments, these small gestures brought him moments of joy and comfort. Seven years ago, we started Team Alex's Toy Drive to spread that same joy to other children. The event has grown year after year, becoming a beautiful tradition that brings our community together. It serves as a powerful reminder for parents and children alike to cherish their blessings, their health, and their happiness."

200 join ABMDR for a chance to save the lives of Maral Boyadjian and others

In February 2025, ABMDR held two donor-recruitment drives in the Los Angeles area, to find donor matches for patients in the US and abroad who urgently need bone marrow stem cell transplantation for a chance to survive their illnesses.

On February 3, ABMDR held a recruitment at St. Leon Cathedral, in Burbank. On February 6, ABMDR held another recruitment, at the Armenian Brotherhood Bible Church, in Pasadena, for Maral Boyadjian as well as all other ABMDR patients. The Pasadena event was organized jointly by Boyadjian's family and ABMDR.

Boyadjian, the principal of Sahag-Mesrob School, suffers from Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML), a type of blood cancer. Her only chance for survival, like all ABMDR patients, is to have a bone marrow stem cell transplant, which would be possible only if she is matched with a compatible stem cell donor.

At the recruitment drive in Burbank, 24 supporters signed up as potential bone marrow stem cell donors. At the Pasadena event, 176 supporters joined the ranks of ABMDR.

"Becoming a donor is a simple, safe, and painless process, and promises the deeply rewarding chance of saving someone's life," said ABMDR president Dr. Frieda Jordan. "I'd like to thank everyone, including our new donors, our volunteers, St. Leon Cathedral and Arch. Hovnan Derderian, as well as the Armenian Brotherhood Bible Church, for enabling us to hold such vitally important community events." Dr. Jordan further stated that anyone between the ages of 18 and 50 and in good general health can join ABMDR to become a donor for a chance to help save someone's life.
